Closing the 'Skills Gap' by Preparing Young People for Today's Job Market

According to the U.S. Chamber of Commerce, there are 5.6 million jobs that remain unfilled because employers cannot find workers with the required skill sets. At the same time, there are an equal number of young Americans aged 16-24 who are neither employed nor enrolled in school. Some estimate that this 'skills gap' costs our economy \$160 billion annually.

Every year, the Old Dominion Job Corps Center provides education and training to more than 325 young adults preparing them to find quality jobs and become contributing members of their communities. Currently, 92% of students obtain full-time employment, enroll in higher education or enlist in the military upon completion at the Old Dominion campus. The Old Dominion Job Corps Center is part of a national network of residential campuses administered by the U.S. Department of Labor. Odle Management manages the day-to-day operations at Old Dominion, along with eight other campuses across the country.

Academic Education and Social Skills Training

Old Dominion Job Corps provides academic training, including basic reading and math. Courses in independent living, employability skills, and social skills are offered to help students know what is expected from employers to ease transition into the workplace. Students interested in transitioning into the military are tutored on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) exam.

Safety is a top priority at Old Dominion Job Corps and the Center consistently ranks near the top in Student Safety Satisfaction surveys. The Center is committed to ensuring that every qualified student obtains his or her high school diploma prior to completion of the program. Students who don't already have a high school diploma upon their arrival at the Center can enroll in our Penn Foster high school program. Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE) assessments are offered according to the Virginia Department of Education requirements.

Transforming Lives, 24/7 Residential Care

Job Corps is the only program that teaches life training skills by providing a full residential experience. Job Corps' zero-tolerance policy for drugs, alcohol, and violence ensures safe environments. Counselors, academic and vocational instructors, and residential advisors work with students 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to teach responsibility, citizenship, and financial literacy. The Old Dominion Job Corps Center offers students:

- ✓ A safe, secure home with supervision and mentoring from caring adults
- ✓ Three meals a day as well as basic health care
- ✓ School and Trade specific clothing
- ✓ Leadership development programs
- ✓ SGA and Student Ambassador programs
